<i>Stig of the Dump</i>	<i>Clive King</i>	Stig of the Dump is a classic children's novel about a young boy called Barney who encounters a strange cave dwelling creature called Stig. Stig takes Barney on a series of fantastic adventures into prehistoric times.
<i>The Stone Age: Hunters, Gatherers and Woolly Mammoths</i>	<i>Marcia Williams</i>	Marcia Williams embraces the Stone Age topic with her distinctive comic-book style. This informative text covers a range of sub-topics including prehistoric animals, hunter-gathers and Stone Age tools. This is a book with a high level of visual appeal and is particularly popular for engaging reluctant readers.
<i>How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth</i>	<i>Michelle Robinson and Kate Hindley</i>	A fun and quirky picture book doubling as an instruction manual for the 'mammoth' task of washing this prehistoric beast. This is a humorous and creative text.
<i>The Boy with the Bronze Axe</i>	<i>Kathleen Fidler</i>	Set in the Scottish settlement of Skara Brae, The Boy with the Bronze Axe has a story line filled with exciting challenges and mysteries. Perfect for confident readers.
<i>The History of Prehistory</i>	<i>Mick Manning</i>	With two modern day children as guides, we take a trip back in time to the formation of planet Earth and move forward until we reach the Bronze Age, the invention of writing and the beginning of recorded human history. End matter comprises a glossary and a timeline which is entertainingly presented as a game.
<i>Stone Girl Bone Girl. The Story of Mary Anning of Lyme Regis</i>	<i>Laurence Anholt</i>	This picture book tells the story of Mary Anning emphasising the influence of her father on her developing interest in fossils. Spiritual, almost supernatural elements are introduced into the story – Mary was struck by lightning as a baby, also the little dog who helps her to find the ichthyosaurus embedded in the cliff at Lyme Regis mysteriously disappears afterwards.
